<p>Job Summary</p>	<p>Our Wrangler leads all equestrian activities at the camp, including preparing the horses, supplies, and horse areas for the camp season, caring for the horses daily, leading rides for campers, teaching campers about horse safety, and ensuring campers' safety around the horses. The Wrangler plays an integral role in the spiritual and physical development of campers by challenging campers to experience God through facing fears, learning new skills, and exploring His creation through horses.</p>

<p>Qualifications</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● At least 18 years of age ● At least two years of experience with horses ● Comfortable riding and handling horses of all sizes ● Must be able to provide basic coaching for beginning riders ● Preferably able to provide coaching to intermediate and advanced riders ● Very strong work ethic
<p>General Outline of Responsibilities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Before camp season, prepare and organize horses, supplies, horse feed, and horse areas <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Sweep tack helmet, and feed sheds ○ Move tack from green tack shed and garage to corral ○ Get helmets and boots from the bunkhouse basement down to the helmet shed, unpack, and organize them ○ Clean, oil, label and organize tack; inspect to make sure tack is safe and in good condition ○ Fill in low areas in the tie lot ○ Find horses and ride each one to ensure they are safe for campers; make sure horses will cross creeks ○ Arrange for horses to be brought to the camp and incorporated into the herd before June ○ Assemble first aid supplies for horses ○ Repair fence as needed ○ Weed eat, mow, and trim back brush all the way around the corral pasture ○ Restock fly spray and lice spray, salt blocks, saddle cleaning supplies, hoses, etc. ○ Spray wasp/hornet nests ○ Find hay, find donors to donate hay if possible, and arrange for hay to be brought to camp ○ Order, pay for (the feed store doesn't take credit cards), pick up, and unload grain ○ Move round bale feeders to appropriate spots

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Deworm and vaccinate horses (this is a two-person job) ● Participate in activities at the camp, including leading rides, teaching campers about horse safety, and ensuring campers' safety around the horses ● Feed daily, ensure that horses have access to water, and provide basic medical care to horses if needed ● Arrange for farrier to come as needed; help farrier ● Challenge campers to experience God through simple devotions involving horses; encourage campers to face fears, learn new skills, and explore God's creation through horses ● Support camp programming by being present and available to campers and staff when not at the corral or on break
Hours	<p>Our wrangler is expected to stay at Jensen Woods for the months of June and July and may be asked to work before or after these months, depending on the camp's needs. The wrangler is expected to feed daily - even on the weekends and is expected to be at the camp to host rides for specific family camp weekends. Our wrangler is expected to be available to help with emergency horse care at all times but is allowed several hours of "break time" each week as arranged with the camp director.</p>

General Outline of Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Help feed horses daily ● Provide basic medical care to horses if needed ● If Full-time, the Assistant Wrangler will also assist at campsites and with other camp activities as needed. (Room and board provided for full time positions.) ● The Assistant Wrangler will have most weekends off, as coordinated with the Head Wrangler and Camp Director ● Other duties as assigned by management
